Kristiania University College: Emergency Preparedness for Employees Abroad

When you, as an employee, travel abroad, your immediate supervisor is responsible for following up on crisis situations.

If you are on a study trip with a class, you, as the course coordinator, should follow up on incidents (see also separate procedure from Student Services).

These are considered serious incidents:

- ➤ Affecting you as an employee alone:
 - o Death, Serious illness, Serious accident
 - o Violence, Criminal act or terrorism, Arrest
- > Affecting the local community:
 - o Natural disasters, Political unrest, Terrorism or Outbreak of war

Before the trip, you as a Kristiania employee (alone or on a study trip with students) should:

> Arrange the trip abroad with the host institution and with your immediate supervisor

➤ Inform your immediate supervisor about: The purpose of the trip abroad, host institution, location, duration, contact information

➤ Obtain necessary information:

o About travel planning in the Employee handbook (chap. Travel): Contact person in HR, insurance, booking and reimbursement of travel and accommodation, assistance with repatriation

o Print out the emergency information (cf. the HSE handbook) and note local information >> In connection with study trips:

o Register the study trip participants with names and contact information

o Inform your immediate supervisor and the Department for Research Administration and Internationalisation about the participant list

In the event of a serious incident during the trip abroad:

In serious incidents affecting the local community, you as an employee abroad should:

- > Follow the instructions from local authorities, the host institution, and possibly the landlord
- ➤ Follow the advice of Norwegian authorities
- > Notify Kristiania University of Applied Sciences: immediate supervisor.

o For study trips: International team, international@kristiania.no

- Request support (see overview of contact information in case of crisis situations)
- ➤ Kristiania University College has entered into an emergency agreement with the Seamen's Church for assistance. The Seamen's Church has a 24-hour emergency phone, +47 951 19 181

When a crisis occurs, you can:

> Call the local emergency number (also available in the Norwegian Seamen's Church App).

➤ Check <u>UD's website</u> for what services and what type of assistance you can expect from the foreign service. Contact the nearest <u>diplomatic mission</u> for advice on further handling of the case.

- > Request help from the local police, fire brigade, doctor, or ambulance
