Shorter exchanges	All programmes are open for shorter exchanges.	

Courses offered in English	Kristiania University College offers both a wide variety of bachelor and master courses taught in English. These courses, including past courses, are listed on our webiste.
Course structure and study plans	Please view available subjects/courses in English on our website.
Structure of study programmes	Bachelor: 3 years, 180 ECTS. Most courses give 7,5 ECTS. Master: Modules of 3-4 weeks. 2 years full time, 3 years part time, 120 ECTS.
Grading system	The Norwegian grading system consists of two grading scales: one scale with the grades pass or fail and one graded scale from A to E for pass and F for fail. The graded scale has the following qualitative descriptions: A – Excellent; B – Very good; C – Good; D – Satisfactory; E – Sufficient; F – Fail. The scale is used absolutely (criterion referenced assessment).
Transcript of record	The student can order a transcript of record in "Studentweb" for a limited time after the exchange (approx. 6 mths). A digital transcript (pdf) will be generated automatically to the document folder in your profile.
