The normal application deadlines are as follows:

- For the Autumn term and full year, the deadline is 30 July
- For the Spring/Summer term Study Abroad option, the deadline is 15 November
- For the Spring/Summer term Study Abroad + internship option, the deadline is 15 October

Please note these are subject to change.

## Language requirements

Our English Language requirement is higher grades at CEFR Level B2, or IELTS 6.0 for Undergraduates and IELTS 6.5 for Postgraduates. We can accept IELTS certificates, university and college transcripts, and reference letters from tutors as evidence of your English language level.

## Academic Information

### Term dates 2026/27

#### Autumn term

Term: 21 September – 11 December 2026

#### Spring/Summer term

Term: 04 January – 11 June 2027

*Teaching finishes at the end of the spring term on 19 March 2027. There is then a break for Easter and the summer term begins on 19 April 2027 and runs until 11 June 2027. If students take modules that are assessed by exams, then they are required to be on campus in the summer term to sit those. If students choose modules that are assessed by essays, then this can usually be submitted online.*

#### Full year

Term: 21 September 2026 – 11 June 2027

## Modules

Students can only select modules from across different departments except for **Fine Art and Design**. Students wishing to study **Fine Art** can only study Fine Art modules and must study for a full year. Those wishing to study **Design** can study for a semester but can only select Design modules.

**Module selection takes place via an online form, which is sent to autumn and full year students in July and to spring/summer students in November. Students are required to complete this form to select their modules.**

Undergraduate students generally study 4 modules per term. This equates to 60 CATS (30 ECTS).
